

There was concern expressed regarding funding for the replacement vehicle not being included in the current budget. Mayor Ellis mentioned that the funds received from the vehicles going to auction added to the insurance money should come close to covering the cost of the new vehicle.

Subject: Workload Analysis

Recommendation: "That the Belleville Police Services Board receive for information the workload analysis report and select a Board member to participate in the research and development of a workload analysis of the Belleville Police Service."

Background:

At the June 16, 2011 Police Services Board meeting the Chief was requested to follow up on a workload analysis for the Belleville Police Service. As a result several initial documents have been reviewed by other Police Services who have commenced work load analysis. The seriousness of calls, the number of patrol units needed to answer them and the amount of time spent responding to calls are all variable factors that must be considered along with the call rate. Response time is an important measure of performance especially for emergencies, maintaining public safety, apprehending offenders and protecting property. Administrative duties and problem solving time are also important considerations. There are many changes and reviews (Zone policing, differential response, problem solving....) ongoing within the Belleville Police Service to identify and improve our efficiency within all areas of the Service.

The Chief is currently in the process of scheduling a meeting to learn more on current workload analysis and how the Belleville Police Service is best suited to approach this important task. The Belleville Police Service Board will be updated in the fall of 2011.

Subject: Bike Patrol

Chief's Recommendation: "That the Belleville Police Services Board review and file for information the Bike Patrol report."

Background:

The Belleville Police Service has implemented bike patrols within the uniform division. These new police patrol bicycles will become a valuable tool for the members of the Belleville Police Service. Bike patrol officers will utilize the equipment from early May to early November, weather permitting.

The bicycles essentially offer many of the same advantages of both foot patrol and mobile patrol without any of the accompanying disadvantages. Bike patrol officers are very accessible to the public, and can maneuver into areas that are impassable by patrol car. Officers are able to patrol areas that are not easily accessible with cruisers, while also providing a quicker response time to calls for service than patrolling on foot. For example, bike patrol officers can patrol areas such as Zwicks Park, Meyer's Pier, Riverside East and West, soccer pitches, townhouse complexes as well the entire trail system that extends from Herchimer Avenue to Sidney Street and north from The Bay of Quinte to Hwy 401 – 13.5 kms of trails through 500+ acres of parkland. Additionally, bike patrol will greatly assist during the many summer festivals, rock concerts, and the like.

In response to concerns raised in each zone and with the assistance of the Crime Analyst, bike patrol officers will pay particular attention to areas in the City that have been identified as having a greater rate of community issues. One of the key duties of the bike patrol officer will be to provide a highly visible officer presence in their zone, and to build relationships with community members.

Through the generous support of local businesses - Peter Smith Chevrolet Oldsmobile, Canadian Tire Belleville, Kelsey's and Montana's and Mark Hanley of Tim Horton's - the cost to get BPS officers back on bikes is completely covered making this program cost neutral.

Subject: Service Excellence

Chief's Recommendation: "That the Belleville Police Services Board review and file for information the Service Excellence report."


Background:

Members of platoon D and K-9 are to be commended for their exceptional teamwork and communication in the investigation and apprehension of the male responsible for the robbery at the Shell Gas Bar on July 12, 2011. The platoon received the call at 2354hrs and at 0022hrs, the accused was in custody after a short foot pursuit and then K-9 track to his hiding place. Everyone played a vital role in this incident and it was a shining example of Service Excellence. Sgt Sweet was the initial officer on scene and containment was set up quickly with the assistance of PC Charbonneau, PC Bucci, PC Walsh, PC Kiley and PC Head. While travelling on the Veteran's Bridge to the location, PC Hounslow observed the suspect running in the park area and as a result, containment was immediately moved and set up in the area. A short foot pursuit by PC Charbonneau provided officers with the opportunity to gather evidence that the accused had dropped as well as coordinate new containment for PC Joly who was en route. PC Joly and Diablo were able to track the path of the accused to his hiding place. An arrested without incident was made. The Sergeant on platoon was extremely impressed with everyone involved in this incident from dispatchers CRO Creelman and Foulkes effectively communicating the necessary information to the final arrest and investigation.

On 18 March, 2011 at 0213hrs, police were called to Little Texas, 290 North Front Street, with regard to a disturbance. Police responded. While responding a male was observed lying in the southbound lanes of North Front Street out front of the bar. Police observed that the male was bleeding from the head. Police also observed a female who was lying on the ground on the sidewalk near the exit to Little Texas. Police observed that there was a large crowd, 50 to 70 people, gathered in the area. Police requested ambulance attend for the male laying on the road. He was semiconscious, bleeding from the head. Pedestrians were in the area to assist him until ambulance arrived. Police attempted to speak with witnesses; however, the majority of the persons in the area were heavily intoxicated and all of which the police spoke to claimed that they had not seen what had happened. The male had severe head injuries and the female was knocked unconscious. This investigation was taken over by Detective Constable Ron Kanyo. These investigations which happen at or near a bar are very tough as the majority of the time the witnesses have been drinking

and/or do not want to get involved. In this particular case it was the perseverance and tenacity of Kanyo that led to the identification, arrest and conviction the offender in this incident. Many relationships needed to be developed with witnesses in order to bring this investigation to a successful conclusion.

Subject: Canine

Chief's Recommendation: "That the Belleville Police Services Board review and file for information the canine report."

Background:

In February 2011 the Ottawa Police Service Canine Unit assisted the Belleville Police Service in locating Police Service dog "Rony" in Pennsylvania, U.S.A. from a kennel that specializes in police service dogs.

In April 2011, Constable Jeff McNevin and PSD Rony commenced a 16-week training course for canine handlers at the Ottawa Police Service. During the first month of the training process, the Instructor identified some issues surrounding Rony's tracking performance. Attempts were made to continue working with and correct this issue with Rony but were unsuccessful. The Instructor removed Rony from the training course and supplied a second dog, Jack. This dog was being held for an upcoming course. The Instructor advised that Jack excelled at the tracking portfolio, and had already exceeded Rony in this area. Jack is also a socially well-balanced dog with a high drive, eager to work and please.

PSD Jack was paired with Constable McNevin at the beginning of May and they successfully completed the Canine course, graduating on July 22nd, 2011. Within a week of returning from training Constable McNevin and PSD Jack have already had their first successful track.
