Chief McMullan distributed copies of her PowerPoint presentation in regards to the Downtown Initiative, a copy of which is attached and forms part of these Minutes as Appendix "1" The Initiative covers the period November 24, 2011 to December 31, 2011 and is in response to concerns regarding safety and Police presence in the downtown core.

Chief McMullan noted the area on Front Street north of Campbell Street as having a high rate of assistance calls with Tuesdays and Thursdays being the highest call out days especially between 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. The lowest call out day was Sunday.

The increased presence of officers in the downtown core was as a result of Chief McMullan's directive and she noted that the Officers were diligent in enforcement without targeting individuals, many of whom are well known to social agencies.

Chief McMullan reviewed the types of calls responded too and noted that some calls are not crime related and hoped that through the Mayor's Task Force information can be disseminated that would allow store owners, DBIA, etc. to contact the right social agency for assistance thereby eliminating the Police level response.

Chief McMullan noted that 26 hours of community service was logged by volunteers patrolling in the downtown core.

Chair Dolan commented on the 240 hours of Police presence in the downtown core during the Initiative period.

Chief McMullan advised that other projects or services within the Department were reduced or stopped during the Initiative and she would be unable to commit these resources long term.

Chief McMullan advised that the Downtown Initiative did not, at any time, detract from community safety.

38 day Core Initiative Overview

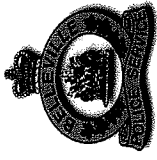


Background:

This year, a new campaign - Pedal for Hope – was launched from April 30th to May 4th, 2012 in Belleville. Members included eight members of the Belleville Police Service, four members from local detachments of the Ontario Provincial Police, three Belleville Auxiliary members and numerous Belleville community policing volunteers in support of the Canadian Cancer Society. EMS also supported this week long event.

A team of officers pedaled from April 30, 2012 to May 4, 2012, approximately 200km in a week to visit ten elementary schools where assemblies were held and visited three additional schools to deliver the message of cancer prevention, support and raise money for the Canadian Cancer Society. A lot of fun along the way was had by all involved. This tour also involved a number of local children and their families who are currently battling cancer.

The Pedal for Hope team had an extremely successful first year. They attended ten school assemblies and visited three other schools. They raised over \$15,000.00 for pediatric cancer. All members of the team are to be thanked for their commitment to the cause.

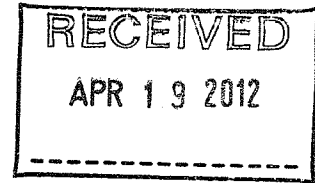

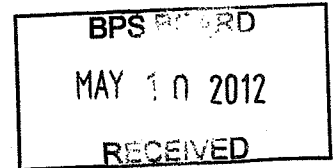
