

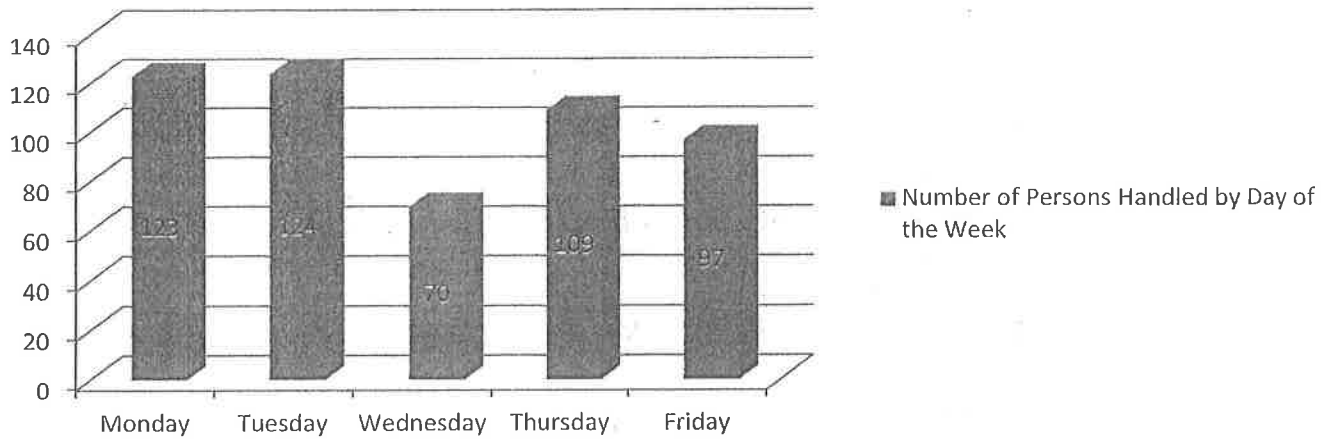
Note: Quinte West, Centre Hastings, North Hastings and Prince Edward are OPP detachments.

The following graphs indicate the number of prisoners handled at the Quinte Courthouse. This is where a prisoner is arrested the day before or day of the court appearance. The prisoner is not transported on the escort wagon and would not be captured in that data. The prisoner would attend the courthouse, be housed, escorted to the courtroom and released. The stat would not be captured in the number transported.

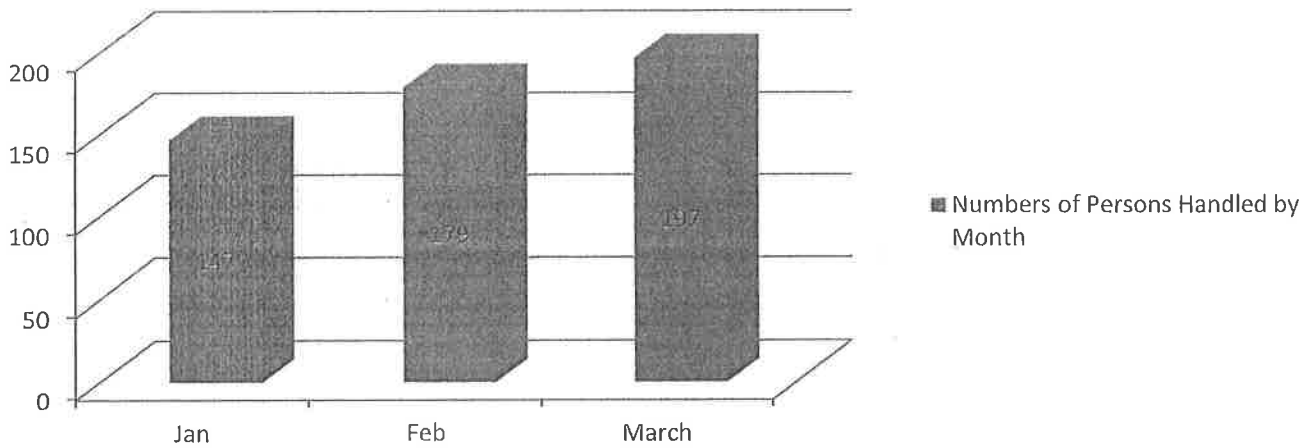
For comparison, the number transported is 487; the number handled is 523 for the first quarter of 2016.

The following graphs indicate the number of prisoners handled during the first quarter for a total of 523 (565 in 2015); 268 (285 in 2015) Belleville Police Service prisoners and 255 (280 in 2015) for the other services and OPP detachments.

Subject: Auxiliary Constable Program

Chief's Recommendation: "That the Belleville Police Service Board receives and file for information."

Background:

The current Auxiliary Constable Program authorized strength is 10 members. The members of the Auxiliary Constable Program shall complete a minimum of 12 hours of service per month, which includes training, ride-alongs and community projects/programs. Auxiliary Constables are allowed to provide a personal reason to the coordinator to allow flexibility with service time. This happened this year for an Auxiliary Constable who took a short leave of absence to complete their Masters. Last year, 2015, marks the first time in history that we have allowed Auxiliary Constable(s) to remain with the program while employed on a part time basis with the Service as a Special Constable, this has been a successful trial to date.

Personnel

The current Auxiliary Constable Program is authorized for a total of 10 members which places very high demands on those members based on the increase community involvement requests. There are currently three vacancies in the unit as two Auxiliary Constables have been hired as Constables with our Service and a third member resigned from the Auxiliary Unit.

The total hours volunteered by our auxiliary constables was 1,517 hours for 2015. The Auxiliary Constables had a total of 617 hours of patrol ride alongs and 523.5 hours of Community programs, and 285 hours of training.

Auxiliary Constable Training

The training program was broken down into bi-month training, the members chose which training session best suited their situation. We made month one a Wednesday night from 18:00 to 21:00hrs and month two a Saturday morning from 08:00 to 11:00hrs. Auxiliary Constables also had a full ten hour day on firearms training in the fall. We covered the following topics in 2015;

- Handcuffing (first 20 minutes of every training class)
- Notebook training
- Legal authorities/use of force model
- CEW-Taser familiarization
- O.C-pepper spray familiarization
- Baton
- Defensive Tactics (search of persons)
- Vehicle stops
- Traffic management
- Firearms familiarization (pistol and patrol carbine)
- Officer safety
- Tactical communication
- Fitness test offered

Conclusion

The Auxiliary Constable Program had a very successful year. The fact that our 10 Auxiliary Constables put in 1,517 hours is outstanding. The program is currently facilitated by Cst.Patrick Comeau of the Training Branch. The authorized strength is 10 and we currently have seven members and will need to start an auxiliary selection process in early 2016. The senior management was approached in the fall of 2015 for the prospect of selecting a Sergeant rank for the Auxiliary Program, hopefully in early 2016 we can select one of our members.

The selection process for Auxiliary Constables based on past practice is to contact the community to ask for candidates, second step is a fitness test comprising of the police fitness pin test, followed by interviews and a background check.

The Belleville Police Service will be preparing a business plan to present to the Board with a request to increase the Auxiliary Constable authorized strength. In order to meet the demands placed on the members along with training and ride alongs additional members will be required.
